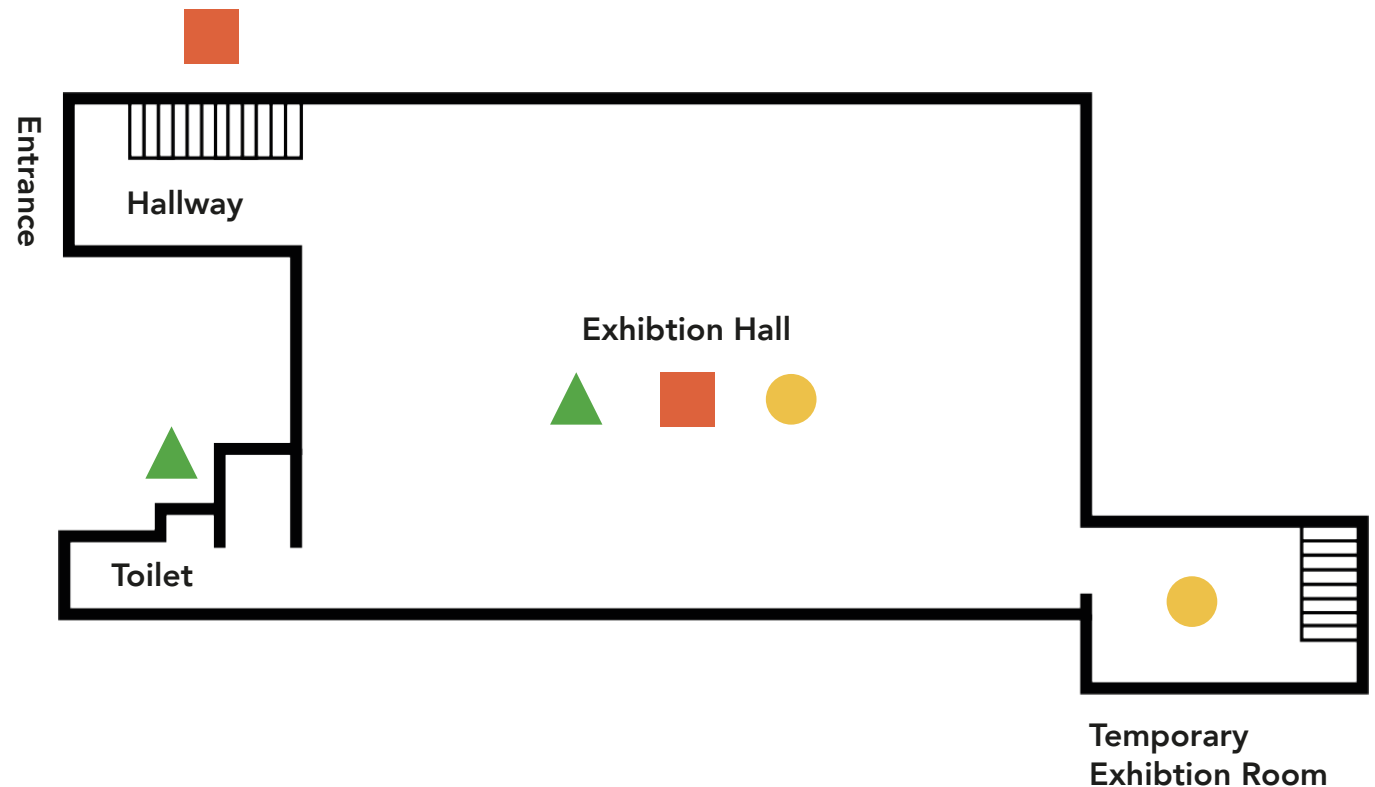
Ground Floor

Most of the things to see in Royston Museum can be found in the main Exhibition Hall.

The Hall is big so noises and voices are loud and echoey. It also has lots of lights.

Because the building is old, and is filled with old things, there is sometimes a musty smell.

-  **Sight** - Bright lights
-  **Smell** - Old, musty smell
- Food smells
-  **Sound** - Loud, echoey noises and voices
- Creaky stairs




First Floor

Currently, only the balcony on the first floor is open to the public. There is a gallery up there where you can see lots of pictures.

The balcony overlooks the Exhibition Hall on the ground floor. It is quite high so you might struggle if you do not like heights.
